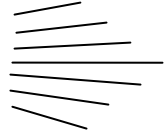

### **Call to Order:**

The regular meeting of the planning council was called to order at 7pm on Tuesday May 10th in Our Saviors Lutheran Church by Gene Mensing .

**Opening Prayer:** Ruth opened with prayer

### **Treasurer's Report:**

Treasurer's report was reviewed. Matt added Current fund balance sheets as well as a Balance trend to give a visual representation of the overall trends in Checking, Joyful Response; Music Fund and Library Fund.

### **Pastor's Report:**

Pastor is at a conference so was not in attendance.

### **Old Business:**

A. May Voters meeting; Things to be added to the Agenda:

1. District Remittance: Discussion about what will be done with it; i.e. How to distribute funds (split 50/50 or give 100% to district). It was decided at the previous meeting to take this to

the Voters and let them decide- without any recommendations. The question was asked" Will the District no longer forward funds to the synod ". Matt will look into this and will clarify before the voters meeting.

2. St Peter Congregation: exploration of a mission church is in the very early stages: Information will be shared with the voters.
3. Offer on Schultz house. Let congregation know what direction this is going.

***New Business:***

- A. DCE Replacement: Elders & youth committee are doing a self-study to decide whether to hire a DCE or Pastor. Dave Hendley is interested and has been helping out with youth activities already. This would be short term, and part-time work (10-15 hrs week) pay would be a stipend of \$500.00 to 600.00 a month. Motion was made, seconded and passed to offer the position to Dave, contingent on passing background check. He is still seeking full-time job.
- B. Carnival will be July 31st at Noon. VBS goes from Aug 1-4 6-8 Pm. Cost \$1,050 is mainly "big stuff". This year, Ruth also bought VBS program. Board sign-up sheet was sent around. Request for donations will be put in the bulletin. VBS has done well with special offering in the past. Non-members go up every year gets larger but overall numbers are stable. Most of it is paid for, but still has some things left to pay for so is requesting funds from other sources.
- C. Annual financial Review. Gene will contact Gary Schuft to go through all of the accounts.
- D. Linen Fund: Gene and Michelle each received a letter requesting that funds which were moved from the Linen fund to the Relocation fund, now be returned to the Linen fund since they were not utilized. The letter included the possibility of the purchase of an automated coffee maker which could cut down on waste. Coffee maker may have more hidden expenses. Any Kitchen issues should go through

the board of Deacons since the Kitchen fund is under the Board of Fellowship. Designated funds were assigned a code. Gene will speak to the donor to find out if he is open to suggestions of ways to use these funds that best serve the needs of the congregation.

***Board Sharing:***

Board of Elders: Voted to pay Andy through the end of May in lieu of his vacation time /sick leave that he has accrued. It was moved, seconded & passed. The Elders are starting a self-study process to decide if we should get a DCE, second pastor or which direction they may go.

Board of Children's ministries: there are only two Sundays left in the Sunday school year. Summer Sunday School begins June 5. Summer Sunday School is Family oriented. High school Kids can be involved.

Board of Deacons: Received two volunteers for fellowship committee: Becky Rose & Deb Otto.

***Closing Prayer:***

Meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

***Adjournment:***

Meeting was adjourned by Gene Mensing. The next general meeting will be at Our Saviors Lutheran Church on June 14, 2011 at 7pm.

## OSLC Treasurer's Report Commentary Period Ending April 30, 2011

This report is Year-to-Date as of April 30, 2011. It includes the following documents: Income & Expense Report by Account, Balance Sheet by Account, and Bank Account Balances Less Dedicated reports. The April 2011 bank statement was reconciled on May 4, 2011 and the month was closed on May 4, 2011. An Accounts Balance Trend graph is attached.

### Income & Expense Report by Account:

Total receipts for the month were \$46,065.29; this includes \$2,748.00 from Joyful Response. Expenses for the month totaled \$37,343.78, resulting in a positive cash flow of \$7,990.73.

General Fund performance is presented in the following table. The difference between the disbursements and the expenses presented in the Income & Expense Report by Account is the LCEF loan principle reduction which is reflected in the Balance Sheet.

***Recommend reading and resources in our church library***

***Ruth's pick for June:*** Thieliicke, Helmut. *Our Heavenly Father: Sermons on the Lord's Prayer.* Grand Rapids: Baker, 1974.

*Location:* Section 5

Have you ever read a book that was so comforting and so eloquent that you wished you could memorize it? That was my experience with this book. Thieliicke preached these sermons on the petitions of the Lord's Prayer as his city of Stuttgart was being bombed to rubble by the Allies at the end of World War II. Yet in this context, he was still able to preach about a Father through whom all events had to pass and who transforms all of them, even sufferings and sorrows, to His children's good. I strongly recommend this book and thank the Library Guild for making this treasure available in our library. But if it's out when you look for it there, check with me and I may be able to lend you my copy –

because I bought a copy for myself within minutes of reading the first chapter.

*From the Stewardship Committee:*

**In June we celebrate Father's Day.** A good and godly father is one of the best earthly gifts that anyone can have. Those of us who have had good and godly fathers know this to be true. A good and godly father loves his children and shows that love by giving good things to them. In His Sermon on the Mount Jesus pointed out that that even evil fathers know how to give good gifts to their children, like giving bread instead of a stone or giving a fish instead of a snake (Matthew 7:9-10 NIV). Jesus went on to say that if earthly fathers know how to give good gifts to their children, then how much more will our Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask Him!

We are children of the Heavenly Father because of what Jesus has done for us through His suffering, death and resurrection. Our sins are taken away because Jesus took upon Himself the punishment that we deserved and paid our debt in full! What this means, among other things, is that we are now able to freely and joyfully live as God's redeemed stewards.

A steward is not a slave who has to do the master's bidding; but is instead a steward who has the privilege and responsibility to manage of all that our Heavenly Father entrusts to each of us. We call that by the title of "all of life and life's resources." We confess with the Scriptures that "*The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world and all who live in it.*" (Psalm 24:1 NIV) When we acknowledge this truth then we can grow in our understanding of the difference between being an owner or a manager.

Dr. Martin Luther said it so well in his explanation of the First Article of the Apostles' Creed.

**I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.**

What does this mean?

*I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul; eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses and still takes care of them.*

*He has also given me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I need. He daily and richly provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.*

*He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil.*

*All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.*

All that we do as children of the Heavenly Father is our stewardship—a response to His amazing grace and extravagant love.
