National Mission Grants in September and October recognize Providing Food and the Gospel to Starving Children and the Mercy House for Women and Children. Mercy Meals of Siouxland began packaging fortified rice/soy meals in 2012. They donate all packaged meals to Orphan Grain Train for Christian organizations in India, Haiti, Romania, and Ecuador, as well as to Navajo reservations in the Southwest and Ysleta Mission in El Paso, Texas. Children and families receive food and hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. An LWML grant will feed from 50,000 to 75,000 hungry children. The Franklin Avenue Mission has purchased a residence to be used as a Mercy House for housing women and children in a safe, caring, Christian environment, where the best practices of parenting and relationship building can be modeled and taught.
