From Pastor Matheny

For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

-Romans 6:14

Thankfully none of us have ever been enslaved. Since our country outlawed the legal owning of slaves more than 150 years ago (well before any of us were born) the concept of slavery has for us been only that: a concept. We have never been under any real threat of being enslaved, of interacting with enslaved people, or of owning slaves ourselves. Thank God for that.

But we have all certainly felt the sensation of being bound by things, of having something other than ourselves exercise dominion over us, of being under the control of a power not our own. We have been under the authority of bosses we didn't particularly like or agree with. We have felt constrained by our financial situations, we have been caged by our past decisions or promises. We have been compelled by our relationships and commitments. Worst of all we have felt the power of our own sinful inclinations and desires drive us to live in ways that are not pleasing to our Savior, and that lead to pain and suffering for us and for those around us.

But in this month's memory verse we hear the apostle Paul proclaim to us that we are not under law, but under grace. Sin he says will have no dominion over us. He says this (as you can more clearly see in the preceding verses of Romans 6) because we have inherited the death and resurrection of Jesus as our own. We no longer live as those compelled to obey God's will as an obligation but as those who, having been cleansed and freed by God Himself, are free to follow His will joyfully. Thanks be to God that He has redeemed us by the blood of Jesus so that we may live always under His grace.

- 1. President Matt Brand called the meeting to order at 6:31 P.M.
- 2. Opening Prayer was led by Pastor Adam Matheny.
- 3. There was no public/congregational Presentation.
- 4. Built on The Rock: Chapter 14 covers Caring for the Body of Christ. Discussion followed on how are we providing the avenues on a personal and church wide basis for connections and community. President Matt Brand requested the members continue to pray and think about what can be done to improve in this area and read 1 Peter 4:7-11. During the March 14, 2023 meeting discussion will be on Chapter 15.
- 5. Additions/Approval of the Agenda: Motion made and seconded to approve the agenda as presented, motion carried.
- 6. Motion made and seconded to approve the January 10, 2023, Planning Council minutes, motion carried.
- Pastor Adam Matheny reported southern Minnesota Pastors' Conference will be held in Lakeville instead of Mankato. Pastor noted he will be teaching on the Sacrament of the Altar (Lord's Supper) for Lent services.
- 8. Treasurers Report, Doug Haeder reported an unusual month due to change in billing cycle for employee benefits and one time giving gift. Motion made and seconded to approve the report as presented, motion carried.
- 9. Unfinished Business
 - A. Sanctuary Art Project: Pastor Matheny is in the process of arranging trip to Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church, Waterville, MN for congregation to view their art work and inquire about the process.
- 10. New Business

- A. Mt. Olive School Request: A request was received to rent three (3) classroom spaces and gym space for 6th-8th grade for the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 school years. Discussion included reaching out to Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, any possible tax consequences with rental income, and establishment of a committee. The committee will be a member of the Board of Trustees, Pastor Matheny, Matt Brand, Valerie Elliott, and Doug Haeder.
- B. Custodian Position: Zac Painter is leaving in mid-March for another position, council members expressed their thankfulness for his work. We will plan to have meal after the second service on March 19th to honor Zac and express our thankfulness for his work. The position will be advertised, it is a full time position with benefits. The Board of Trustee is reviewing contracting out aspects of the custodian position, but initially it appears to be too expensive.
- 11. Board Sharing: **Deacons**: Chili cook off and Bible trivia went very well, need volunteers to make prayer shawls, continuing to work on greeter program, and kitchen cleaning is Saturday, February 18th. **Endowment**: Explained what is an endowment fund and reviewed activities of the Board. **Education**: Quarterly meetings for Sunday school teachers has resumed, need for volunteers to staff the nursery during Sunday Bible study, reviewing insurance information on background checks and sexual assault policy for the church and developing survey about alternative format(s) for bible studies. **Trustees**: Reviewing custodian position.

- 1. Acting President Dan Gahler called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. Opening Prayer was led by Dan Gahler.
- 3. There was no public/congregational presentation.
- Built on the Rock: Chapter 15 covers Cultivating Lifestyles of Reconciliation. Discussion followed on reconciliation ministry on a personal and congregational level. During the April 11, 2023 meeting, discussion will be on Conclusion: Built on the Rock.
- 5. Additions/Approval of Agenda: Motion made and seconded to approve the agenda as presented, motion carried.
- 6. Motion made and seconded to approve the February 14, 2023, Planning Council minutes as corrected, motion carried.
- Acting President Dan Gahler read Pastor's report which noted enjoying Lent services, good turnout for visit to Waterville for the Sanctuary Art Project and going well with call committee visit in St. Louis.
- 8. Treasurer's Report: Acting President Dan Gahler provided summary of reports. Motion made and seconded to approve the report as presented, motion carried.

 - 1. Mt. Olive School Request Dan Gahler and Matt Williams walked through the building with the Mt. Olive group. Mt. Olive will discuss and reach back out to us. Mt. Olive is looking at 2024-25 school year but trying for the 2023-24 school year. The space would be used for 6th 8th grades with approximately 20 students per grade. Dan Gahler reported there is a possibility of income tax if usage is 15% or more of the space.
 - Custodian Position Matt Williams reported the trustees have interviewed a candidate and are recommending hiring that person. There was a question about retirement benefit,

- Dan Gahler will contact Concordia for clarification. Motion made and seconded to approving hiring per the trustees' recommendation, motion carried.
- 3. Capital Improvement Fundraising Table to next meeting.
- 4. Call Committee Judd Schultz reported committee presented with four candidates from St Louis and two from Ft Wayne to interview, but one candidate from Ft Wayne declined to be interviewed. The committee decided to interview all candidates. Interviews will be a mix of committee members in person and via zoom. The committee will meet after the interviews to provide recommendation(s) to the seminary.
- 10. New Business: No new business.
- 11. Board Sharing: Elders: Ezekiel will be participating in the church and church services during summer break from seminary and will be using unleavened bread baked by youth for communion on Maundy Thursday; and will have the ushers or a couple from the congregation bring the offering forward during the offertory. Education: Lisa and Christine will review church's insurance company request for updated sexual assault policy and bring to board for review; Sunday school teachers will be leading music; Rally Sunday will be Palm Sunday: providing play area for children of attendees of Sunday adult Bible study, but unable to find volunteers to childcare; and confirmation will be April 30th. Trustees: No other report, besides previously discussed custodian position. Endowment: will have display at Rally Sunday. Deacons: Marcella Eilders has volunteered to lead the Prayer shawl ministry; Greeters program still looking for volunteers; Wednesday night meals through April, except Holy Week; Women's Retreat will be March 18th; reception for Zac Painter will be March 19th after 10:30 a.m. service; blood drive will be April 24th; and organizing a group for Faith Night at Moondogs game on June 4th.



The Our Savior's book club meets from 4:30-6 in the fireplace room on the second and fourth Sundays of each month.



Bible Reading Plan - May

Redeem is not a common word these days. Paying a ransom might sound more familiar. It includes being released because of a payment. The main event in the Old Testament is being set free from slavery in Egypt. Jesus comes as a redeemer in the New Testament to set us from sin and death.

In the Old Testament redeem also entails a reclaiming as one's own. God often refers to the Israelites as "my people". He is taking responsibility for their protection and provision. He is also saying they are welcomed into His kingdom. We are claimed as God's own being adopted into His family.

Lutheran Bible Translators have been working with the Department of Mission and Theology of the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus and The Institute of Sierra Leonean Languages to take the Gospel of Jesus Christ to people in their own languages. We celebrate Ascension on May 18th and Pentecost on May 28th. Let us prayerfully study the words of Hymn LSB 576 "My Hope is Built on Nothing Less"

1. My hope is built on nothing less Than Jesus' blood and righteousness; No merit of my own I claim But wholly lean on Jesus' name. LCMS Stewardship Ministry: Follow Him in Generosity

Our Savior calls us to follow Him in generosity. "For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you" (John 13:15). We cannot give our lives for the salvation of the world, of course. Praise God, that job's already done! But with hearts full of thanksgiving for what Jesus has given us, we can follow His example of generous giving. And Jesus' generosity is not merely an example. Our Lord also commands us to act according to our gifts: "The one who contributes, [let him give] in generosity" (Rom. 12:8).

So, when we bring offerings to the Lord, we should strive to heed His command and follow the pattern He has established for us. Jesus did not give us leftovers. He gave His best. We should not give leftovers, either, but the first and best of what He has given us. Jesus did not give as an afterthought — He gave according to the plan of salvation God established from

the foundation of the world. So, when it comes to our own offerings, we should make a thoughtful plan to give generously, in proportion to the way He has blessed us. Like the Macedonian Christians, who gave according to their ability, and even beyond their ability (2 Cor. 8:3), we should honor the Lord by giving a generous portion of the income that God provides us.

We should also give freely, just as Jesus gave freely for us. There is no compulsion involved in our works of love and our offerings to the Lord. We do not give grudgingly, but willingly and cheerfully, each "as he has decided in his heart," as the Lord says (2 Cor. 9:7). There is no New Testament ceremonial law involved here. Rather, we are free to give as generously as our Savior has given for us!

In the same way, our Lord teaches us to give generously out of our love for Him and for our neighbor. Jesus shows us that genuine love is always love "in deed" (1 John 3:18). It is love that sees our neighbor in need and gives generously to help him. It is love that hears the Word of the Lord and does what it says. If we truly love, we give generously. If we give without love, our giving is not truly following Jesus.

Finally, we follow Jesus in generosity when we support His Gospel ministry and other works of mercy. The people of Israel gave generously to construct and support the operation of the taber-nacle, for that was the place where the Lord received the Old Testament sacrifices, through which He bestowed the forgiveness of sins on His people. So, they gave abundantly, so abun-dantly they had to be told to stop giving! (Ex. 36:5–6). In the same way, we should bring gener-ous offerings to support the Lord's work. We support our congregations in the preaching of His Word, Baptism and the Lord's Supper, which bestow His gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation, and we take care of those who are poor and needy.

Our Savior calls us to follow His example in generous giving. Let us then, with thankful hearts, rededicate ourselves to following Him in generosity.
