

Summer Service Schedule

This summer we will once again adjust our service schedule for the summer months. This schedule will be in effect from June 2nd through September 1st. We will once again move to one Divine Service a 9:00. Responses from the congregation following last summer showed that many people enjoyed the opportunity to see and speak with their brothers and sisters that they usually miss by attending different services, as well as the improved singing from a fuller sanctuary. Bible class will once again follow our 9:00 service.

In addition this year we will be adding a couple of additional opportunities to be in God's Word and fellowship on Summer Sundays. We will begin the day with the order of Matins. Matins is a morning order of prayer and meditation that is intended to prepare the faithful to begin the day and on Sundays to prepare the saints to receive the Lord's Supper. Matins will go from 8-8:30 and will feature different liturgy (likely one familiar to many of you) and different readings from the Divine Service. Following Matins we will have a time of fellowship together having prepared ourselves to meet the Lord in His Sacrament.

If you have any questions about the order of Matins or about the summer schedule please reach out to one of our elders or to Pastor Matheny. We would love to hear what you think about these plans! We hope that this new summer schedule will be a blessing to you and your family and to our whole congregation as we seek to make Christ known.

Please also remember that Sunday morning and other worship times are not for bringing church business to other members or staff but for focusing upon the Word and gifts of God. "The seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work." - Exodus 20:10 *"For the Lord gives wisdom; from His mouth come knowledge and understanding." -Proverbs 2:6*

There is no shortage of information nowadays. You can learn things anywhere! You can learn about the weather from passersby on the street, or from the weatherman, or from that app on your phone. You can hear the latest news from your neighbor who learned it from who knows where, or from the newspaper, or from Twitter or Facebook or some other online source. You can get advice on how to remodel your bathroom from YouTube, or from the salesman at Menards, or from your friend who happens to be a plumber. All of these sources on off of these topics will give you information about different aspects of what you are interested in with differing degrees of applicability to you and with various amounts of accuracy. The question that quickly confronts most of us when faced with these situations is, "Who is it that I can trust?"

That is where June's proverb comes in. This verse cuts through all the noise of our current situation and sets us all straight. If we seek wisdom (and we should!) then we should look to the Lord. This verse does not say that all those other sources of information are necessarily wrong or that they are all completely untrustworthy. But it does say quite clearly that if we want to know where we can look with certainty to find wisdom, knowledge, and understanding then we should look to the Lord and to the words of His mouth.

How can we make sense of all the information that is swirling around us? How can we be sure that what we are hearing is true? Simple. We hear God's Word. We read it and we mark it and we take it to heart. We read it when we lie down and when we walk by the way and when we rise. And then everything else gets sifted by God's Word.




LWML Mites Mites for Missions
