"The seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work." - Exodus 20:10 "Faithful are the wounds of a friend; Profuse are the kisses of an enemy." -Proverbs 27:6

Everyone loves to hear themselves complimented. We like to hear others say how great we are. In fact we enjoy it so much that we do not even give much care if our complimented knows what they are talking about! In this proverb the Lord warns us that our craftier enemies will be well aware of this all too human weakness and they will exploit it to our harm.

Contrast that kind of behavior with that of a true friend. It is all too difficult to tell our friends things that we know they do not want to hear. It is uncomfortable to criticize in meaningful ways the ones we love and it is perhaps even more uncomfortable to receive meaningful criticism from those who are near to us. The Lord here is instructing us to wisely hear and value the criticism we hear from those who care for us (and prudentially offer it to them in return!) while discounting or discarding the compliments that our enemies might use to butter us up.

This proverb is a wonderful illustration of how our Lord treats us. While our world (which is our enemy) would simply affirm us in all our ways and all our thoughts and tell us that we are perfect just the way we are, that is not what the Lord does. The world would affirm you and encourage you to only affirm the actions of others only because the world does not really love you. The Lord on the other hand truly does love you. That is why He calls you to repent. He urges you by His Word to turn from your wicked ways, to amend your life, and to receive instead His ways of life and salvation. All this our Lord does out of His fatherly divine goodness and mercy and because in truth He is your dearest friend.

Bible Reading Plan – July

After the Fall, something new entered our world – pain and suffering. There became pain in childbirth and pain in working the ground. Both could be described as pain in labor. In the Bible, pain often refers to something not just physical but includes more of a deep emotional sense. We may use the word suffering in this way. It could be either or both. Think of the things Job endured – loss of family, in his own body, and the scorn of others. He hurt. Think of the suffering that Jesus went through – the reject in addition to the physical. Pain and suffering is a part of our earthly life.

The Bible describes the worst pain as a woman in labor. War is described as the beginning of birth pains for the end times. A time of enduring and straining. The rich man wants Lazarus to ease his agony in hell. Heaven is the place where the suffering ends. There is relief. In the meantime, the Church labors for new children to be welcomed into the Kingdom. For the Christian, suffering is temporary and may be part of our witness.



From the Stewardship Committee: The Rewards of Godliness

It's no secret that you can't bribe your way into heaven. No amount of good works will impress God enough to open heaven's door for their sake. "For the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23) and the person who "keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it" (James 2:10). Rather, salvation is "the free gift of God ... in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:23).

So, your good works won't earn you the reward of heaven. But does that mean that there are no rewards at all? Consider what the Small Catechism says in the "Close of the Commandments":

What does God say about all these commandments? He says, "I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5–6)

What does this mean?

God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands. (SC II)

God promises to bless you in keeping His commandments. What might these blessings be? Well, consider what Paul says about keeping the Fourth Commandment: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' (this is the first commandment with a promise), 'that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land'" (Eph. 6:1–3).

And think about what your life would be like if you went around stealing (breaking the Seventh Commandment), telling lies about people (breaking the Eighth Commandment), and generally being cruel to those around you (breaking all the commandments!). That is obviously not a blessed way to live. In fact, you'd be miserable living that way.

And Jesus says more about what is in store for those who make sacrifices for His sake: "Jesus said to them, 'Truly, I say to you, in the new world, when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for My name's sake, will receive a hundredfold and will inherit eternal life'" (Matt. 19:28–29).

So don't grow impatient in doing good. Follow the Lord who has freely given you everlasting life.
