"The seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work." - Exodus 20:10 "Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name!" - Psalm 100:4

As God's people, this verse invites us into the presence of God with hearts overflowing with gratitude, not because of our own merits, but because of His boundless grace in Christ Jesus. We know that we are sinful and cannot approach God's holy presence by our own righteousness. Yet, Psalm 100:4 calls us to enter His gates boldly. How? Through the gate of Christ, our Savior, who has opened the way to the Father by His atoning sacrifice. The "gates" and "courts" symbolize God's divine presence, where we, justified by faith, are welcomed to worship. This is no mere suggestion but a command rooted in the Gospel— God desires our praise, not as a work to earn favor, but as a response to His unmerited love.

Thanksgiving and praise, as Luther taught, flow from faith in the Word. When we confess our sins and receive absolution, when we hear the Gospel preached, or when we partake of the Lord's Supper, we stand in God's courts. These are not our works but His gifts, stirring us to bless His name. True worship is faith receiving God's promises. Thus, our thanksgiving is not self-generated but the Spirit's work in us, responding to Christ's redemption. In a world of fleeting joys, Psalm 100:4 reorients us to the eternal. We give thanks because God's mercy endures forever (Psalm 100:5). Let us, then, enter worship—whether in church or daily life—with hearts confessing Christ, praising His name, and trusting His grace alone.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, we thank You for welcoming us into Your presence through Jesus. Grant us grateful hearts to praise Your holy name. Amen.

From Pastor Koopman

Come, You Faithful, Raise the Strain

"Alleluia! Now we cry to our King immortal, who, triumphant, burst the bars of the tomb's dark portal."

The 8th century hymn, *Come, You Faithful*, by John of Damascus, has been sung during the Easter season for well over a thousand years, and for good reason! In the first stanza of this hymn the image of God rescuing His people from bondage in Egypt through the Red Sea is set before our eyes, and then the remaining stanzas connect the Red Sea deliverance to Christ's Resurrection and our deliverance from sin and death. Given our recently commissioned artwork placed on the walls, it seems appropriate to meditate on how the deliverance at the Red Sea connects to Easter.

The Israelites were in bondage and slavery to the Egyptians, and were freed from their bondage during the Passover, when God killed the firstborn sons of the Egyptians and passed over the Israelite households who had slaughtered a spotless male lamb. Christ is our Passover Lamb, the spotless Lamb of God, the first-born beloved Son of the Father, whose blood was shed so that eternal death may pass over us.

The Israelites were led into the wilderness, and the Lord divided the waters of the Red Sea so that the Israelites could pass through the waters, while the Egyptians were drowned behind them. We Christians are rescued from sin and death when we pass through the waters of baptism, and our old sinful nature is drowned behind us. We are like the Israelites, crossing through the Red Sea, the enemy is chasing us, the Lord is conquering our foes, and freedom is on the other side of the water.

The Lord leads us throughout our wanderings in this desert on earth from death to life. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is therefore a deliverance as bright as the sunrise, and gladens our wearied hearts. He gives peace to the troubled heart when we see that the tomb could not hold Him in! The prisonhouse of death has been rent asunder by our immortal King, so that just as death cannot hold Him, neither can it hold us! God has brought His Israel into Joy from sadness!



First Confirmation Class - Our Saviors 1950-1951

Palm Sunday, March 18, 1951, eight; young; future communicant members were confirmed in the faith at Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Mankato, Minnesota.

Marion (Thom) Brunz, who is still presently a member of Our Savior's, has shared that their

instruction was held in a room just inside the main entrance of the streetcar barn turned sanctuary. She also shared that the day of their confirmation, Mankato was experiencing a blizzard. Because of the blizzard only some of her relatives were able to share in the plans for the day.

Another '51 member of the class is Carole (Schmidt) Esterberg, sister of Diane Schmidt who is a member of Our Savior's. Carole, who lives in Maple Grove, MN, is a member of Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church, Plymouth MN. She has also shared the blizzard saga. Living on the farm her father had to make sure all the animals were taken care of and secure from the storm. With that and then finding their way into town, she was late for her confirmation service. Then to top it off they were unable to make it back home. They spent the rest of the day and night at her grandmother's, whose house was halfway between church and home.

Another tidbit: While Carole was the first class confirmed in the streetcar sanctuary, her sister, Diane, was the first class confirmed in our current sanctuary, April 7, 1963.
