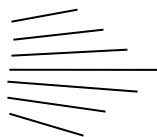

“He who justifies the wicked and he who condemns the righteous
are both alike an abomination to the Lord.”

-Proverbs 17:15

In a world that constantly blurs the lines between good and evil, Proverbs 17:15 stands as a sharp rebuke from the God of perfect justice. The Holy Scriptures declare that calling evil “good” or pronouncing the innocent “guilty” is no small matter—it is an abomination to the Lord. This is not merely a warning about corrupt judges or politicians. It cuts to the heart of every human heart, for we are all by nature children of wrath, experts at self-justification.

This verse exposes our sinful tendency to twist God’s holy Law. We justify our own wickedness with excuses: “I’m not that bad,” or “Everyone does it.” At the same time, we are quick to condemn others while ignoring the beam in our own eye. Yet the Law always accuses. It shows us that apart from Christ, we stand condemned—rightly so.

Here the Gospel breaks in with glorious clarity. The true Judge did not justify the wicked by ignoring sin. Instead, at the cross, the Righteous One was condemned in our place. Jesus, who knew no sin, became sin for us (2 Corinthians 5:21). The Father declared guilty the only truly Righteous Man so that He might declare us—the wicked—righteous by faith alone. Our justification rests entirely on Christ’s perfect obedience and atoning death, received through faith as a free gift.

This truth humbles us and sets us free. It calls us to stop playing God by justifying sin in ourselves or others. Instead, we speak the truth in love, call sin what it is, and point the guilty to the Savior who justifies the ungodly (Romans 4:5). In our vocations—as parents, citizens, friends, and workers—we strive for earthly justice while clinging to the heavenly verdict pronounced over us in Baptism: “Not guilty, for Christ’s sake.”

Lord Jesus, keep us from the abomination of calling evil good or good evil. Guard our tongues and hearts. When we are tempted to self-justify, turn us again to Your cross. Strengthen our faith in Your justifying grace, that we may live as forgiven people who forgive others. Amen.

God Loved the World So That He Gave

*“God loved the world so that He gave
His only Son the lost to save,
That all who would in Him believe
Should everlasting life receive.”
- LSB 571:1*

Do you want more people to join our congregation? Do you want more people to repent of their sins and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of their sins? Do you want more people to be delivered from hell and receive eternal life with you? Of course you do! Every Christian desires these things!

So how does this happen? Well, this doesn't happen just by hoping, but God works through means. God works through Christians in order to make more Christians through the proclamation of the Gospel. If you want to see more Christians then that means you need to open your mouth and speak.

That thought can be quite daunting to many Christians. But it doesn't have to be daunting. It's actually very simple. In the hymn *God Loved the World So That He Gave* we have a very basic presentation of the Gospel. This hymn was written by Johann Olearius in 1671. Olearius was a brilliant man. Court preacher and a leading theologian of his time. He wrote a systematic theology, a commentary on the entire Bible, and many academic and devotional books. Perhaps his brilliance was his ability to simply and clearly explain Christianity, as he does in this hymn. The first stanza is a versification of John 3:16. The following stanzas ground our faith in Jesus's sacrificial work on the cross and point us to our hope of eternal life.

None of us need to be as brilliant of a theologian as Olearius in order to tell another person about Christ and the reason for the hope within us. But we do need to be able to present that

truth of the gospel simply and clearly. Whether you're talking with your neighbor, your cousin, or the random guy you meet at Hy-Vee, I encourage you to strike up a conversation with them this month and present the gospel to them simply. "Hi, God loves you by sending His Son Jesus to save you by dying and rising for the forgiveness of your sins. I want you to know this, so I want to invite you to my church this Sunday."

Define Your Life by How You Give

Winston Churchill reportedly said that “we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give.” According to Churchill, our lives are defined not by what we have gotten, but by what we give away.

Our Lord’s life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God’s Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserved for our sins. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death and hell. And so it is that by giving completely of Himself, He got for Himself us, making us citizens of His eternal kingdom by grace.

As it was for Jesus, so it also is for us. We get more from giving than we do from simply getting. For, giving softens our hearts and frees us from the grip which the worries of this world and making a living have on us. When we are singularly focused on making a living, we are singularly focused on what we get. That mindset begins to bleed into all areas of our lives — our relationships with friends and family, with neighbors and coworkers and with the Lord. It shifts our focus from asking the question, “How can I be a friend, family member, neighbor and servant to others?” to asking the question, “What have they done for me lately?” We become more selfish instead of selfless.

But when we give, we do not have less, nor do we become less; rather, we have more and become more. When we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the Divine Nature. As Jesus said, “It is more blessed to give than to receive” (Acts 20:35).
